



KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

Who is at risk of being arrested by ICE?

Legal Permanent Residents [LPRs] with prior convictions

You may be a priority target if:

- You have a conviction for a felony, or certain serious misdemeanors, even if it is from years ago, or you were never in jail.
- You committed fraud in your green card application.

Undocumented people with arrests or convictions, or who arrived since 2014

You may be a priority target if:

- You have been arrested or convicted of a felony, or criminal offense like DUI; drugs, domestic violence; unlawful gun possession; child endangerment, etc.
- You entered after January 1, 2014.
- You have a prior order of deportation.

IF YOU OR SOMEONE YOU LOVE IS DEPORTABLE, HAVE A PLAN!
