Council President Karcher called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M. and read the open public meetings statement as follows:

*“This meeting is called to order pursuant to the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Law. This meeting of April 22, 2008, was included in a list of meetings sent to and advertised in the Princeton Packet and Trenton Times, posted on the bulletin board in the Borough of Princeton municipal building and has remained continuously posted as the required notices under the statute. In addition a copy of this notice is and has been available to the public and is on file in the Office of the Borough Clerk. Proper notice having been given, the Borough Clerk is directed to include this statement in the minutes of this meeting.”*

Council President Karcher read **Agenda Item C, Resolution 2008-R126**, as follows:

**RESOLUTION 2008-R126  
OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF PRINCETON  
INTO CLOSED SESSION ON APRIL 22, 2008**

**WHEREAS**, the Open Public Meetings Act, P.L. 1975, Chapter 231 permits the exclusion of the public forum from a meeting in certain circumstances; and

**WHEREAS**, this public body is of the opinion that such circumstances may presently exist; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body wishes to discuss the following issues:

1. Negotiations — NHKT
2. Negotiations — License agreement

**WHEREAS**, minutes will be kept and once the matter involving confidentiality of the above no longer requires that confidentiality, then minutes can be made public; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the public be excluded from this meeting.

April 22, 2008

Councilman Koontz moved to approve, Councilman Goldfarb seconded. Council members Karcher, Goldfarb, Koontz, Martindell, and Wilkes voted in the affirmative. Hearing no nay votes, Council President Karcher proclaimed the resolution approved.

Borough Council recessed into closed session.

At 7:30 P.M. Council reconvened into open session.

Council President Karcher asked all present to rise for **Agenda Item D, Salute to the Flag.**

Council President Karcher read **Agenda Item E, Approval of Minutes.**

Presented for approval were the minutes of the open session of April 8, 2008.

Councilman Koontz moved to approve the minutes of the open session April 8, 2008, Councilman Goldfarb seconded, and Council approved unanimously as amended by Council President Karcher that she had adjourned the meeting.

Council President Karcher read **Agenda Item F, Summary — Closed Session Discussion — Robert W. Bruschi, Borough Administrator**

Mr. Bruschi reported that Council discussed primarily an estoppel agreement with NHKT and a personal guarantee. Council also went over parameters of license agreement for Cox's Market in a building owned by Hilton Realty, including parking and dumpster issues on Borough property.

Council President Karcher read **Agenda Item G, Public Presentation**, and asked if anyone present wished to address the Council with an issue not on the agenda.

Claire Jacobus, 37 Cleveland Lane, requested reconsideration of the curbing of Cleveland sidewalks. She noted miscommunication between the citizens and Public Works, that the majority of neighbors voted for granite. She proposed a meeting with Public Works and/or Mayor and Council as soon as possible.

Christopher Budzinski, Borough Engineer, stated that the paving/sewer project is ongoing and no curbs have been laid. He reminded the residents of a line item opting for granite at an additional cost of approximately \$100,000 over concrete. He mentioned issues involved in amending the contract as granted.

Nancy Greenspan, 5 Cleveland Lane, cited costs to the homeowners for various materials. She expressed the deep concern of her neighbors and stated their need to return to the table for redress.

Council President Karcher informed the Cleveland residents that action will be scheduled as soon as pertinent research is gathered. A Council agenda on the topic will not be established in Mayor Trotman's absence.

Mark Alexandridis, Princeton Avenue, noted that nearly six months have passed with no new information on the NHKT negotiation provided to the public. It is time to include the community. He requested current financial spreadsheets and public discussion.

Denise, of 3 Greenholme, asked Borough to arrange for tax payments by credit cards online. Mr. Bruschi replied that Borough is proceeding with that change.

Seeing no one further from the public, Council President Karcher closed the public portion of the meeting.

Council President Karcher read **Agenda Item H, Report (1) —First Quarter Financial Report** — *Robert W. Bruschi, Borough Administrator*

Mr. Bruschi reported that a draft budget will be available within the week. A joint meeting with the Township is part of the process. He stated that the budget remains approximately \$25 million. Mr. Bruschi pointed out that fire & housing and construction fees are on the agenda for the first increase in more than 10 years.

Councilman Koontz moved to accept the first quarter financial report and Councilwoman Trelstad seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Council President Karcher read by title **Agenda Item I, New Business (1) — Introduction and Order to Publish: Ordinance 2008-16 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 14 OF THE “CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF PRINCETON, NEW JERSEY 1974” REGARDING FIRE INSPECTION AND FIRE SAFETY PERMIT FEES.**

Councilman Martindell moved to introduce Ordinance 2008-16; Councilman Goldfarb seconded. Mr. Bruschi repeated that fees have not been adjusted in timely fashion and that proposed rates are in line with nearby municipalities’ practices.

Council President Karcher opened the public discussion and asked if anyone wished to address Council on this issue. Seeing no one, she closed the public discussion and returned to Council. Hearing no comment, Council President Karcher called for a roll call vote. Borough Clerk called the roll. Council members Karcher, Goldfarb, Koontz, Martindell, Trelstad, and Wilkes voted in the affirmative. Council President Karcher proclaimed the ordinance introduced with a public hearing to be held May 13, 2008.

Council President Karcher read by title **Agenda Item I, New Business (2) — Introduction and Order to Publish: Ordinance 2008-14 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10, CONSTRUCTION CODE ENFORCEMENT, OF THE “CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF PRINCETON, NEW JERSEY 1974”.**

Councilman Goldfarb moved to introduce Ordinance 2008-14; Councilman Koontz seconded.

Council President Karcher noted that the ordinance was tabled on April 8, 2008, so that Mr. Budzinski could provide more information to Council. Mr. Budzinski explained some fine points of the ordinance as requested previously by Councilman Wilkes.

Council President Karcher opened the public discussion and asked if anyone wished to address Council on this issue. Seeing no one, she closed the public discussion and returned to Council. Hearing no comment, Council President Karcher called for a roll call vote. Borough Clerk called the roll. Council members Karcher, Goldfarb, Koontz, Martindell, Trelstad, and Wilkes voted in the affirmative. Council President Karcher proclaimed the ordinance introduced with a public hearing to be held May 13, 2008.

Council President Karcher read **Agenda Item I, New Business (4) — Resolution 2008-R128** as follows:

**WHEREAS**, by Ordinance No. 2005-12, entitled, "BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENTS IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF PRINCETON IN THE COUNTY OF MERCER, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$481,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$458,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF" adopted May 3, 2005, sidewalk improvements were authorized to be undertaken and the cost thereof was directed to be assessed against the properties in accordance with law; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 1, 2008 said Mayor and Council examined said report and assessments and had considered the same at a hearing after publication and notice to the owner or owners named in said report as required by law, and had found said report in all respects properly made and approved **Resolution 2008-R108**; and

**WHEREAS**, after approval of Resolution 2008-R108 it was discovered that the assessment for the two properties listed below were incorrect which resulted in an overcharge on each assessment.

Councilman Koontz moved to approve Resolution 2008-R128; Councilwoman Trelstad seconded. Mr. Budzinski explained that the property owners had reported an error in their assessments and this resolution corrects it. Borough Council approved unanimously.

Council President Karcher read **Agenda Item I, New Business (5) — Resolution 2008-R129** as follows:

**WHEREAS**, on December 19, 2000 the Borough Council approved the Personnel Policies and Practices Manual; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 4, 2003 the Borough Council approved changes to the Personnel Policies and Practices Manual; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 9, 2003 the Borough Council approved changes to the Personnel Policies and Practices Manual; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 28, 2006 the Borough Council approved changes to the Personnel Policies and Practices Manual; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Administration has recommended a revision to the Personnel Policies and Practices Manual; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Princeton that said Personnel Policies and Practices Manual now be adopted with a revision as recommended.

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council have been advised by the County of Mercer that the Mercer County Emergency Services Communications Center is able to assist the Borough of Princeton in providing a T1 network line for State Police Communications so as to maximize benefits and improve municipal and county emergency communications for the law enforcement community; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Princeton wishes to enter into an agreement with the County of Mercer to allow the Mercer County Office of Information Technology assist the Borough in the installation of a dedicated T1 network line as mandated by the New Jersey State Police;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Princeton, the Borough of Princeton is authorized to enter into an agreement for interlocal services with the County of Mercer for the provision of Installation of State Police Communications Network the form of which is attached to this Resolution as Exhibit "A".

Councilman Goldfarb moved to approve Resolution 2008-R130 and Councilman Koontz seconded. Mr. Bruschi stated that all Borough and Township communication systems are linked; that is, are each other's backup. Borough Council approved the resolution unanimously.

Council President Karcher read **Agenda Item I, New Business (7) — Resolution 2008-R131** as follows:

WITHIN THE PUBLIC RIGHTS-OF-WAY  
BOROUGH OF PRINCETON**

**WHEREAS**, 4Connections, LLC, a New Jersey Limited Liability Company, with a business address of 4 Gatehall Drive, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Parsippany, New Jersey 07054 is authorized to provide telecommunication and related services in the State of New Jersey; and

**WHEREAS**, 4Connections, LLC has requested permission to occupy the Public Rights-of-Way within the Borough of Princeton for the purpose of constructing, installing, operating and/or maintaining a telecommunications system; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Princeton finds the installation of the telecommunications system in the Public Rights-of-Way to be in the best interest of the citizens, including the commercial and industrial citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, the 4Connections, LLC has entered into a written agreement with the Borough of Princeton regarding the use of the Public Rights-of-Way; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Princeton that permission is hereby granted to 4Connections, its successors and/or assigns to occupy the Public Rights-of-Way within the Borough of Princeton for the purpose of construction, installation, operation and/or maintenance of its telecommunications system for an initial term often (10) years commencing on the Effective Date, with possible extensions for up to two (s) additional terms of ten (10) years; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such permission is conditioned upon the terms of the attached Agreement between the Borough of Princeton and 4Connections, LLC; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Clerk are authorized to sign this Agreement on behalf of the Borough of Princeton; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that 4 Connections, LLC is authorized to present this resolution and the Agreement to the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities for ratification, if required, pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 48:2-14*.

Councilman Martindell moved to approve Resolution 2008-R131 and Councilwoman Trelstad seconded. Councilman Koontz noted use of Borough poles by telecommunications companies. Karen Cayci, Borough Attorney, reported that Borough has required only a \$1500 fee in the past. Councilman Goldfarb proposed seeking a bond for removal of cables in the event of bankruptcy or other abandonment of the wires. Councilman Martindell recommended imposing industry standards for storage of communication cables. Councilman Goldfarb moved to table the resolution and Councilwoman Trelstad seconded. Council President Karcher stated the resolution deferred to May 6, 2008, pending research by Mr. Bruschi and his staff.

Council President Karcher read **Agenda Item I, New Business (8) — Resolution 2008-R132** as follows:

**WHEREAS**, the YWCA Princeton sponsors and has planned its annual ets firecracker 5k fun run and walk to be held on Tuesday, June 24 on the ETS Campus; and

**WHEREAS**, the YWCA has requested permission from the Borough of Princeton to install a banner over Washington Road in Princeton Borough with approval of the Office of Community and Regional Affairs at Princeton University beginning Tuesday, June 17 through Tuesday, June 24 2008 to advertise this program to the entire Princeton Community; and

**WHEREAS**, this banner will be promptly removed after its use as required by Borough ordinances; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with Borough Ordinance 3-17 any banner that is removed by the Borough will be held by the Borough for thirty (30) days and then disposed of; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with Borough Ordinance 3-17 any applicant failing to remove a banner will not be permitted to display any banner for the succeeding two years; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Mayor and Council hereby approve placement of said banner on Washington Road in accordance with Borough Ordinances 3-14-3-17.

**WHEREAS**, the membership application has been reviewed by the municipal officers; and

APPROVING THE EMERGENCY ACQUISITION  
OF A PORTABLE EMERGENCY GENERATOR  
FOR THE PRINCETON SEWER OPERATING COMMITTEE**

**WHEREAS**, the Princeton Sewer Operating Committee (PSOC) uses a portable emergency generator (1966 Onan Generator) to operate pump stations and other equipment during power failures, emergencies or when electricity is not available for use in operating specific equipment throughout their sewer service area; and

**WHEREAS**, the above stated portable emergency generator is not working properly and parts are no longer available for use in repairing this unit; and

**WHEREAS**, Robert A. Hough, P.E., Manager of the PSOC, has advised that it is essential to the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Princeton Borough and Township that the PSOC have a working portable emergency generator for use during emergencies; and

**WHEREAS**, any attempt to proceed with the full competitive procurement process to contract for a replacement generator will consume several months; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 allows for an emergency purchasing procedure where the need for certain equipment could not have been reasonably foreseen and the immediate acquisition of such equipment was necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare; and

**WHEREAS**, the PSOC has obtained three (3) proposals for the replacement of the portable emergency generator; and

**WHEREAS**, EMR Power Systems, LLC, Trenton, New Jersey submitted a responsive proposal to replace the portable emergency generator in the amount of \$30,368.00; and

**WHEREAS**, Chief Financial Officer has certified that funds are available to purchase such a replacement portable emergency generator on an emergency basis; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Princeton that an emergency purchase of the replacement portable emergency generator from EMR Power Systems, LLC for \$30,368.00 is hereby authorized; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Mayor and Clerk are authorized to execute the necessary Agreement with EMR Power Systems, LLC.

Councilman Goldfarb moved to approve Resolution 2008-R134 and Councilwoman Trelstad seconded. Councilman Goldfarb explained that sewage in the Borough moves by gravity; in the Township, sewage is pumped. He noted that the resolution clarifies that the Township is responsible for all costs associated with pump stations. Council President Karcher called for a roll call vote. Borough Clerk called the roll. Council members Karcher, Goldfarb, Koontz, Martindell, Trelstad, and Wilkes voted in the affirmative. Council President Karcher proclaimed the motion carried.

Council President Karcher read **Agenda Item I, New Business (11) — Resolution 2008-R135** as follows:

**RESOLUTION 2008-R135  
OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF PRINCETON**

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2008, pursuant to a duly advertised Notice to Bidders, and in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law (*N.J.S.A. 40: 1 1A-i et seq.*), the Borough of Princeton cooperatively with the Township of Princeton received three (3) bids in connection with a Real Property Revaluation Program (“Project”); and

WHEREAS, after consultations with representatives of the Township and the County of Mercer, and upon the recommendation of the Borough Administrator, Borough Tax Assessor the Mayor and Council believes that it is in the Boroughs best interest to postpone the Project until 2010; and

WHEREAS, postponement of the Project requires that the Borough reject all bids; and

WHEREAS, *N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2* permits the Borough to reject all bids if it decides to abandon a project for the provisions of goods and services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Princeton in the County of Mercer as follows:

1. The bids for the Project received on March 12, 2008 are hereby rejected.
2. This Resolution is contingent upon the adoption by the Township of Princeton of a companion Resolution rejecting all bids received for the project.
