

Juvenile Report May 2015

Juvenile Petitioned to Family Court

A 15 year old boy put chewing gum in the ignition of his mother's car and into the locking mechanisms in her home because he was angry that she had disposed of his marijuana. Additionally he stole \$80.00 cash from her purse for the same reason. He was charged with Criminal Mischief and Theft.

A 14 year old boy kicked a skateboard out from underneath an 11 year old boy and physically assaulted him. He was charged with Simple Assault.

A fourteen year old repeatedly punched a 15 year old in the face and head and was charged with Simple Assault.

Juvenile Family Crisis/Mental Health Crisis

A fourteen year old boy destroyed belongings in his family home during a mental health crisis and cut his wrists. He was transported to the hospital for psychiatric evaluation.

A neighbor called police upon hearing screaming and banging from the house next door. Upon arrival police discovered the 14 year old and 13 year old brothers had a physical fight. They were turned over to their relative with no additional action needed.

A fourteen year old female threw objects at her parents while undergoing a medication adjustment. She was calmed at the scene and did not require referrals as she was currently involved in a mental health program.

May 26th- SNB attended the Corner House awards ceremony.


May 27th- SNB attended the Littlebrook PTO meeting to answer questions and address the ongoing "swatting" investigations that our police department was investigating.

Total Arrests






Patrol Overtime




Dispatch Overtime



- ❖ On Tuesday, May 5, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris attended K-9 Patrol In-Service Training. The training was hosted and conducted by the New Jersey State Police in Howell, NJ. The training consisted of socialization, tracking, criminal apprehension, building searching, evidence detection, and obedience.
- ❖ On Friday, May 15, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted an explosive sweep at Rider University for their commencement ceremony. Cpl. Solovay joined K-9 Teams from the Mercer County Sheriff's Office and the West Windsor Police Department. Cpl. Solovay remained on scene for the duration of the ceremony as a visible presence and in case any suspicious bags/packages were located.
- ❖ On Saturday, May 16, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted a small K-9 demonstration for the attendees of the All Wheels Rodeo, which was hosted by the Princeton Police Department and the Human Services Commission.
- ❖ On Tuesday, May 19, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to Johnson Park Elementary School after a threat to the school was received by school administrators. Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted a walkthrough of the school and found no threat present. The K-9 Team also conducted an exterior perimeter check of the school as well as a search of the nearby wooded area. Nothing suspicious was located. The incident is believed to be another case of "swatting," and is being investigated by the Princeton Police Detective Bureau.
- ❖ On Thursday, May 21, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to Princeton High School after a threat to the school was received by school administrators. Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted a walkthrough of the school and found no threat present. The K-9 Team also conducted an exterior perimeter check of the school as well as a search of the building's roof. Nothing suspicious was located.
- ❖ On Wednesday, May 27, 2015 Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted a K-9 demonstration for the Cherry Hill Nursery School. The Princeton Police Department Safe Neighborhood Bureau organized a visit by the police department where the children got to see the police vehicle, a police motorcycle, and the police K-9. The demonstration consisted of light obedience and play drive. The children, approximately 30 in attendance, asked many questions and enjoyed the presentation

- ❖ On Thursday, May 28, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to a bomb threat at the Quakerbridge Mall in Lawrence, NJ. K-9 teams from the New Jersey State Police, the Mercer County Sheriff's Office, and Princeton Police responded and cleared the building. After the search was completed, the building was deemed safe and mall workers and patrons were permitted to return.

- ❖ On Sunday, May 31, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted an explosive sweep at Princeton University for their Baccalaureate Ceremony. Cpl. Solovay was joined by a K-9 Team from the Mercer County Sheriff's Office. Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris remained on scene for the duration of the ceremony as a visible presence and in case any suspicious bags/packages were located.
