
Patrol Overtime



- ❖ On Tuesday, September 1, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris attended K-9 patrol in-service training at the New Jersey State Police K-9 Training Facility in Wrightstown, NJ. The training was hosted and operated by the New Jersey State Police K-9 Training Unit. The training focused on obedience, criminal apprehension, agility, and tracking.
- ❖ On September 8th and 12th 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted an explosive sweep at Boardwalk Hall in Atlantic City, NJ in response to the Miss America Pageant taking place at the venue. The sweep was requested by the Atlantic City Police Department and the New Jersey State Police. Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris joined approximately a dozen K-9 teams from around the state who also assisted with the operation.
- ❖ On Thursday, September 10th and 15th , 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris attended the Crowd Management Training along with other officers of the Princeton Police Department. This training was conducted by the New Jersey Department of Corrections Special Operations Group and involved basic police response to a civil disturbance.
- ❖ On Tuesday, September 22, 2015, Cpl. Solovay attended the New Jersey Detect and Render Safe Task Force Meeting which took place at the Middlesex County Police Training Center. The meeting was attended by dozens of K-9 Teams and Bomb Technicians from across the state of New Jersey. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss safety concerns and task force assignments for the upcoming Papal visit.
- ❖ On Thursday, September 24, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to Riverside Elementary School after a threat to the school was received by school administrators. Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted a walkthrough of the school and found nothing threatening or suspicious. The K-9 Team also conducted an exterior perimeter check of the school as well as a search of the playground. Again, nothing suspicious was located.
- ❖ On Friday, September 25, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to Princeton High School after a threat to the school was received by school administrators. Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to the scene along with police command. After speaking with the school administration the decision was made to evacuate the building and conduct a search of the school with additional K-9 support. The building was evacuated with students and faculty being relocated to the football field. Several other K-9 Units from various jurisdictions responded for mutual aid.

- ❖ On September 26 & 27th, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris were called into service as a result of the full activation of the New Jersey Detect and Render Safe Task Force. The activation came in response to Pope Francis' visit to Philadelphia. Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris were assigned to the Lindenwold Train Station in Camden County which services rail travel to Philadelphia. The K-9 Team worked in conjunction with Bomb and Hazmat Technicians who were also assigned to the station. Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted explosive sweeps at the train station and the parking lots, while also maintaining a proactive police presence in the area. The K-9 team also remained on-call to respond and investigate any suspicious items that were located.

- ❖ On Wednesday, September 30, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to a residence on Brookstone Dr. on a report of a suspicious individual in the wooded area behind the caller's residence. Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris entered the densely wooded area in an attempt to locate the individual. After conducting a thorough search of the area, no individuals or anything suspicious was located.

- ❖ On Wednesday, September 30, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to John Witherspoon Middle School after a threat to the school was received by school administrators. Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris responded to the scene along with police command. Upon arrival, the building was being evacuated with students and faculty being relocated to Princeton High School. The decision was made to conduct a full search of the school utilizing additional K-9 support. K-9 Units from the New Jersey State Police and the Mercer County Sheriff's Office responded to the scene and assisted Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris in the search. After the school was deemed safe, students and faculty were permitted to return to the building.
