

- 4. Sourland Watershed Map (Kevin Burkman, GIS Analyst, Sourland Conservancy/Sands)
 - DEP Trenton employee; Watersheds of Sourland Mountain prepared pro bono for Sourland Conservancy
 - Burkman explained the structure and meaning of the map and important natural areas, specifically related to water
 - Map highlights interconnection of the individual watersheds around the Sourland mountains
 - Map image (high resolution) will be placed on PEC website to be available for public viewing (action item); public distribution is encouraged by Burke
 - Tech-Czarny suggested connection with other municipalities within watershed area would be beneficial with regards to stormwater management; Sands stated that The Watershed Institute was discussing this in the past; Niedergang to inquire about the status.

5. Council Report (Niedergang)

- Farewell to Taylor who will take on a new position with Mercer county; recruitment for replacement and transition (incl. ERI) ongoing
- Municipality announced retirements of two colleagues, i.e. Delores Williams (Municipal Clerk) successor D. Harris, and Chrstina Rothman-Iliff (Call Center Manager);
- Working on new outdoor dining regulations to enable restaurants using new sidewalk space and be responsible stewards
- Special improvement district completed first year and got next year's budget approved
- Council passed ordinance to establish how the Lanwin property will be managed
- Presentation to council on health benefits of passive recreation; Soos suggested municipality to consider more dedicated space for community gardening
- Work ongoing regarding ordinance regarding motorized bikes and scooters on sidewalks
- Soos asked about road safety of Wiggins Road which Niedergang will follow up on (action item)

Sands asked about recently communicated Green Team – Ludmer clarified that Green Team
introduced as part of Sustainable Jersey resolution, covering members embedded across the
multiple sustainability initiatives active within municipality's boards, commissions and committees;
Tech-Czarny expressed that this is not Sustainable Jersey's intent of organizing a green team as
the team should consist of public members, like commissioners from PEC; Niedergang asked if she
could meet with Tech-Czarny to discuss this.

6. Discussions/Decisions & Liaison Reports

6.1. Annual Goals Status & Updates (All)

- Water quality (Smorada): no updates, awaiting feedback regarding tour.
- Community Energy (Soos): asked about Energy Aggregation; Symington informed that next option in spring
- Master Plan (Tech-Czarny): no updates
- Green House Tour (Marcus-Levine, Smith): final approval for videos by municipal lawyers pending; Public video screening planned for Sat Sept 30th at 10 am in Princeton Public Library, private screening hosted by Sustainable Princeton on Tuesday 26th Sept, 5-7pm at Monument Hall, Princeton NJ. Live tour of four locations planned for Sept 30th incl. preregistration and map incl points of interest and 2 people helping to guide public per house.
- Microforest (Sands): grant application submitted; plant selection will occur only after funding is confirmed. Sands asked to think about ideas for understory which is not covered by the grant; Ludmer clarified that saplings are included and planting planned for spring; Soos suggested that donations from master gardeners may be available in spring as well as to ask STC.

6.2. Green Development Checklist (Soos)

- Soos shared copies of proposed new Green Development Checklist drafted together with Tech-Czarny and Marcus-Levine aiming at a shorter, focused list that is easier to fill out;
- Request for PEC members to review and provide feedback, Soos will share electronic version for commenting tomorrow July 27th with feedback due on Wed Aug 2nd (action items) – post-meeting note: draft shared;
- Plan to share draft with Lesko and Weissman Friday Aug 4th to get their feedback


6.3. Board of Health (BOH Representative absent)

6.4. Sustainable Princeton (Ludmer)

- Sustainable Jersey certification submission due July 27th; goal to submit 650 points achieved
- Alex Dill joined as new team member
- Workshop and family day planned at Watershed with Spanish speaking landscapers on Sept 23rd;

6.8. Recreation/CP South (Sands)

- Consultant presented 4 plans; favored plan did not address environmental concerns
 raised; major changes included substantial increased parking despite the municipality's
 position to discourage car use in favor of bikes and walking; concern that existing trees
 may be affected; Plan A will be reconsidered which was preferred by public voting;
- PEC members encouraged to participate in Sept 28th Board of Park and Recreation meeting at 7pm, followed by Council meeting on Oct 9th and possibility for public commenting and written comments to raise environmental concerns (action item); plans are available on the Recreation Department website:
