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RECONSTRUCTION OF BANK STREET AND NASSAU STREET (NJSH RT. 27) STREETScape
(BAYARD LANE TO BANK STREET)

Project Update Notice No. 15

July 29, 2021

Dear Bank Street Residents and Nassau Street Business Owners:

Earle Asphalt Company (EAC) is scheduled to return on **Tuesday, August 3, 2021**, weather permitting, to begin milling and paving activities on Bank Street. If there is inclement weather, the work will proceed on the following business day. EAC is planning to remove and rebuild the full length and width of the roadway with base pavement in one day. Chambers Street intersection is expected to be milled and base paved (curb to curb) on Monday, August 9th. On Tuesday August 10th, the final top layer of pavement will be installed on Bank Street and the Chambers Street intersection

On **Tuesday, August 3rd**, weather permitting, EAC will reconstruct the pavement on Bank Street. Work will begin at Nassau Street and continue to the intersection of Bank Street and Chambers Street. EAC will be detouring traffic away from the Bank/Chambers/Hulfish intersection while Bank Street is under construction. **All driveway access will be closed off during construction hours. The contractor will start at 7:00 a.m. in order to have the road opened by 6:00 p.m.**

For everyone's safety, please use caution when walking or driving near the work zones and be aware of construction equipment operating on the roadways. Do not walk across or allow pets to walk on the fresh pavement during the workday, as it retains heat and may damage your shoes or injure your pet's feet. Please allow extra time for potential delays caused by construction activities.

Bank Street will be accessible outside of construction hours, which means residents can use their driveways at the end of the day. The base pavement will be uneven until final top course paving commences, so residents are urged to use caution when driving, walking, biking, etc. through the newly paved sections of the roadway. Small asphalt ramps will be installed temporarily at manhole lids and driveway aprons until final top course pavement is installed.

Sewer testing activities are expected to occur after base paving and before final top course paving. An additional notice will be sent out prior to this occurring as your cooperation in this matter is very important. EAC will perform sewer lateral and main pressure testing on the entire system. During this time, we request that residents and business employees limit extensive water use (laundry, dishwasher, long showers/baths, limited toilet use) as the sanitary system will be plugged and air pressurized to ensure there are no leaks or cracks within it.

On **Monday, August 9th**, weather permitting, EAC will continue pavement reconstruction at the Chambers Street intersection. **Residents may access their driveways, but vehicles will not be able to exit out to Chambers Street during construction hours. The contractor will start at 7:00 a.m. in order to have the road opened by 6:00 p.m.**

On **Tuesday, August 10th**, the final 2" top course pavement will be installed on ALL of Bank Street and the Chambers Street intersection. **All driveway access will be closed off during construction hours. The contractor will start at 7:00 a.m. in order to have the road opened by 6:00 p.m.**

Regarding the construction schedule, we are now projecting final completion on or about **August 16, 2021**, weather permitting. After all milling and paving activities are complete, EAC will be installing trees; road signs; pavement lines and markings; and the raised crosswalk near Nassau Street.

When roadway and driveway access is closed or limited, residents and businesses shall use the arranged parking as follows:

- 25 parking spaces at Trinity Church designated for residents
- 7 parking spaces along the northern curb of Paul Robeson Place designated for residents
- 8 parking spaces on Mercer Street Extension designated for businesses
- 10 parking spaces along the northern curb of Paul Robeson Place designated for businesses

Please email tsmith@princetonnj.gov to register for a parking placard to utilize these parking spaces, if not done so already. Those who have parking placards, may continue to use them during pavement construction despite the July 31, 2021 date; Parking enforcement will be notified of this. The yellow parking placard must be displayed on the vehicles dashboard while parked at these locations **ONLY**. **These parking placards do NOT allow for parking anywhere else in town.** Overnight parking in these locations is permitted. All parking areas will have signage to show permissible parking spaces.

Despite our best efforts to notify service providers, we advise that there will most likely be disruptions to garbage collection and recycling when work is taking place. Please report missed garbage pickups on Princeton's SeeClickFix system. Missed recycling pickups should be reported directly to the Mercer County Improvement Authority at (609) 278-8086. **Haulers will be notified of the pavement construction schedule and will be asked to collect garbage and recycling at 7:00 a.m. or the following day, if necessary.**

Ian Baker, E.I.T., Construction Engineer, will be acting as the project manager; Inspectors Rich Decker and Tiffany Smith will be on-site each day while construction is occurring.
